

Embark on a visit of the most famous monument in Rennes. This major piece of 17th century architecture and symbol of Brittany served as a court of justice until the French Revolution and hosts today the Rennes court of appeal. Built under the reign of King Louis XIV and reconstructed after the great fire of 1720 by the chief architect of King Louis XV, the monument was greatly damaged by the fire of 1994. Magnificently restored, it permits today visitors to admire fine examples of 17th-century French pictorial art: painted ceilings, sculpted gilded wood panels, and allegorical paintings, culminating in the splendid Grand'Chambre.
