Objectives

The EU Farm to Fork Strategy aims to speed up the transition to a sustainable food system. The Strategy targets a 50% reduction in the overall use and risk of chemical pesticides and the use of more hazardous pesticides by 50%, which should be achieved by 2030. The three EU Horizon-funded projects Brightspace, GeneBEcon, and RATION present their work and cooperation in economic modelling, tackling issues related to the Farm to Fork Strategy. The collaboration, in particular, exists via the economic modelling of the regulatory alternatives for new genomic techniques (GeneBEcon), low-risk pesticides (RATION), and their implications for the measurements of environmental and economic impacts at farm- and market- levels (Brightspace). The workshop aims to present collaborative modelling work and discuss state-of-the-art general equilibrium modelling techniques and applications.
